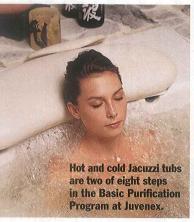

This new 24-hour Korean spa was built with 20 tons of jade (revered in Eastern medicine for its healing powers), including an igloo-like sauna. One warning to the modest: Juvenex's treatments involve a lot of padding around naked. Our Basic Purification Program took us from shower to igloo to cool Jacuzzi to steam room to warm Jacuzzi to massage table (for exfoliation with a rough mitt) to heated bath spiked with milk, gin-



seng, sake, or seaweed powder, and finally to a bamboo mat for a nap. We stumbled out two and a half hours later feeling intoxicated—from relaxation, not the sake. \$105.

To our delight, the point of Maximus spa's Water Jour-

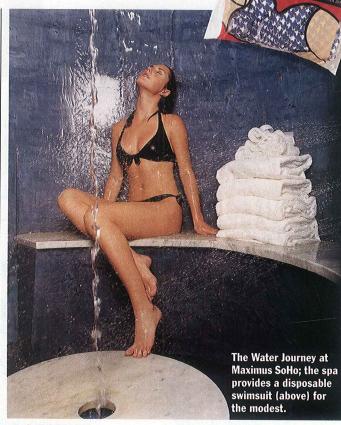
ney wasn't to mess with our chakras or lymph nodes—just to relax us. After aesthetician Dawn Wetherbee had slathered us in a sea-salt-and-shea-butter mash, we entered a circular stall where we sat for ten minutes under cascading warm water, then soaked in a tub as 150 water jets pummeled our weary muscles. And though Wetherbee pushed us to add a massage for another \$55, we were far too relaxed to mind. \$85.

Qiora's Total Experience is part aromatherapy, part reflexology, part facial-and part Star Trek. We reclined in an overstuffed chair while our aesthetician gave us a vibrating footbath, fitted us with headphones playing ocean sounds, and asked us to inhale scented serums to slow our whirring mind. While she applied three consecutive hydrating masks and massaged our legs and scalp, we held on to a warm cloth pad that vibrated to the rhythm of the music in our headphones (a sensation so strangely hypnotic that we actually nodded off). The two-hour treatment did seem to drag on after a while, but it left us with an almost otherworldly calm that lasted well into the workweek.

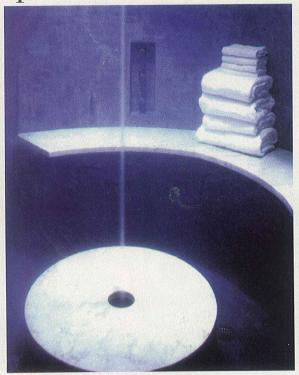
